An Exercise in Hospitality

Here are tips from Priya Parker's clip that will help you get into the hosting mindset.

Step 1

Identify the purpose: What is a need in your life right now that by bringing in a specific group of people might address?

Step 2

Give your gathering a name so the guests can anticipate what it's going to be about.

Step 3

Apply rules to your gathering. What's allowed and what's not?

Step 4

Prepare an opening ritual to get everybody into the spirit of the gathering.

Step 5

Take the Toasts challenge! Invite guests to tell a story from the past few months that no other guest has heard, and how it affected their lens on the world.

Host/ess Diary: My Virtual Gathering

What is the purpose of the gathering?

How will you get the party started?

Each person can take a minute to share a funny camp memory that took place in the scene they chose as their virtual background. In the chat box, each person will be asked to type a memory of their own that's connected to that space.

What are two rules that you'll introduce to your guests when sending them an invitation?

- 2. We'll have a separate meet-up to express disappointment about camp being canceled this summer. For now, this meet-up is about reconnecting with old friends, so let's keep it exciting.
