

ENGRAVING OUR FREEDOM

Pirkei Avot 6:2

And it says (Exodus 32:16): "And the tablets are the work of God, and the writing is God's writing, engraved on the tablets"; read not "engraved" (*charut*) but "liberty" (*chairut*)-- for there is no free individual, except for he who occupies himself with the study of Torah.

Brainstorm words that represent **freedom** to you. These are the words you would like to commit to. Now, let's engrave them!

This project can be done using 3D or 2D materials.

MATERIALS & INSTRUCTIONS

2D

- Clay/model magic/tin foil or (any other material you can find around your house to sculpt with)
- Pencil/sharp object for engraving

Using your 3D material, create a shape to represent your freedom.

Once you have your shape, take your engraving utensil and engrave your words on the object you have just created.

3D

- Colorful oil pastels or markers
- Black paint
- Pencil or object for engraving
- Paper

Using your paper, color the background with oil pastels or markers.

Then paint over the pastel with black paint. Using your engraving utensil, engrave your words of freedom.
